- **Grade A (Sterile Filling Lines & Laminar Flow Units):** To prevent any risk of contamination, we do not physically enter Grade A areas. Instead, we use specialized long-range macro and zoom lenses, filming safely from Grade B areas or through protective glass viewports. This allows us to capture stunning close-ups of active filling needles and capping operations without compromising sterile safety.

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
